

Walkouts and medal forfeits



BOXING (2007 Korat)

SIX Filipino boxers forfeited their gold medal bouts to protest against alleged bias in judging, which favoured the Thai pugilists. The Filipinos decided not to fight in their finals – all against Thai boxers – and took home silver medals.



SEPAK TAKRAW (2007 Korat)



THE national sepak takraw team pulled out of the Games after the International Sepak Takraw Federation (ISTAF) rejected Malaysia's protest on the use of rubber ball in the biennial Games.

SWIMMING (2013 Naypyidaw)



FILIPINO Jasmine Alkhaldi was stripped of the women's 100m freestyle gold medal following a protest by Thailand, who claimed that everyone had dived in at the sound of the first horn. Thai swimmer Natthanan

Junkrajang was the only one to have waited for the second horn before jumping in. Junkrajang won gold ahead of Singapore's Quah Ting Wen in the re-swim the next day while Jasmine took bronze.



SHOOTING (2003 Hanoi)

VIETNAM had their gold medal in the 50m rifle three position revoked after Thai officials lodged a protest claiming that the hosts' shooters – Dang Thi Ngu and Dang Thi Hang – had tampered with their shooting jackets. The gold was awarded to the Malaysian trio of Nurul Huda Baharin (pic), Nur Suryani Taibi and Nordalilah Abu Bakar.
